## MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR - Joseph P. Tursi

I hope that you are all enjoying the summer.

Having endured the COVID pandemic for the last year and a half, life as we knew it appeared to be getting back to normal. But, we now find ourselves having to deal with the Delta variant. Early indications state that this variation is more contagious than the initial strain. I urge all residents to please get vaccinated. While the vaccine does not protect one from getting or transmitting the disease, it will reduce your likelihood of getting extremely sick.

I am happy to announce that the After-School Program at the Youth Center will begin again in September. Information regarding registration dates and cost can be found below in the Hillburn Youth Center section of this newsletter. The program will be adopting health guidelines that are in place by the Suffern Central School District.

On July 10th, the Village held a memorial service honoring former Mayors James R. Brown and Brian L. Miele at Veterans Memorial Park. Speakers at the event included family, friends and colleagues of Brian and Jim. The Village Gazebo was named in honor of Mayor James R. Brown and Fourth Street was memorialized as Mayor Brian L. Miele Way, next to the bridge that he fought so hard to keep open during its replacement by the NYS Thruway Authority. I would like to thank everyone who attended, as well as the committee that helped to organize the event honoring these two amazing men.

Later this summer, the Village street repaving project will continue. The work will take place as follows: Fifth Street from Mountain Avenue to Hickory Avenue, Hickory Avenue from Fifth Street to Sixth Street and Sixth Street from Hickory Avenue to Rockland Avenue. The project will utilize funding provided to the Village by the New York State Programs PaveNY and CHIPS.

Household Hazardous Waste will be collected on Saturday, August 21st from 8:00 AM to 12:00 noon at the DPW building on Terrace Avenue. Paint, oil, batteries, pesticides, etc. will be collected. Free Methane Detectors are available at Orange & Rockland's online store, while supplies last, at <a href="https://free.myorustore.com">https://free.myorustore.com</a>. Eligibility restrictions: Must agree to install the device in your residence serviced by Orange & Rockland; and there is a limit of 1 per household in 3 year period.

#### **IMPORTANT REMINDERS**

<u>Unregistered Vehicles</u> – In accordance with Village Code Chapter 250 - §17-G(2)(a), storage of unregistered vehicles is prohibited in all districts. Violators are subject to fines.

<u>Lawn Maintenance</u> – In accordance with Village Code Article I, §184-1-A, failure to keep grass properly trimmed is a violation. Violators are subject to fines.

Reminder to Dog Owners – In accordance with Village Code Chapter 65, Section 65-5-A(4), it is prohibited to allow your dog to defecate on public property without properly removing the dog waste immediately. BAGS OF DOG WASTE SHOULD BE DISPOSED OF PROPERLY IN YOUR TRASH RECEPTACLE AND ARE NOT TO BE THROWN ALONG THE SIDE OF THE ROAD!! Violators may be subject to fines. Please take pride in our community and have respect for your neighbors by working together to keep it clean.

Street Lights - Please report any street light outages to the Village Office, as soon as possible.

<u>Household Garbage</u> - Garbage must be bagged and placed in proper receptacles. Receptacles are not to be placed at curbside any earlier than the night before the scheduled pick-up date; and, <u>are to be removed from curbside the day of pick-up.</u>

### 2021 Bulk Trash Pick-Up Schedule

Weather permitting: Mondays: August 16th September 20th October 18th

This schedule MUST be followed. Property owners who place trash at curbside any earlier than the weekend before the scheduled pick-up date are subject to penalties. Once the DPW has collected bulk trash from your street, you CANNOT place any additional bulk trash at curbside. Construction debris will NOT be collected and is not to be placed at curbside.
